

2019 GORDON HAY SCHOLARSHIP Procedures and Guidelines

for High School Seniors

Each year the Gordon Hay Scholarship Committee selects a student to receive a unique \$5000 scholarship. The Gordon Hay Scholarship benefits a selected student within the Charlotte region who demonstrates technical or artistic accomplishment in a non-performance area of the performing arts. The award is designed for special learning opportunities related to the recipient's career interest in a non-performing area of the performing arts. Opportunities include but are not limited to professional conferences, seminars, workshops, participation in an unpaid internship program, technology, books, supplies, and professional performances. This award may <u>not</u> be utilized for school tuition, class fees, or college living expenses.

Allocation of the award will be administered by the Education Department of Blumenthal Performing Arts. To draw from the award account, the recipient must submit a formal request to Blumenthal's Education Department. It is possible for a recipient to utilize the entire award amount within the first year of college or to occasionally draw from the account as opportunities arise within a four-year undergraduate career. If the total amount of the award is not used during the undergraduate experience, the award recipient will not be entitled to a cash settlement upon graduation.

Eligibility

- Student is a graduating high school senior, college freshman, or college sophomore at the time of application.
- Student must be pursuing an undergraduate degree in a non-performance discipline of the performing arts (music composition, directing, costume design, set design, lighting design, sound design, stage management, arts administration, arts education, etc.)
- High school student must reside in one of the following Charlotte-area counties: Alexander, Anson, Cabarrus, Catawba, Cleveland, Gaston, Iredell, Lincoln, Mecklenburg, Rowan, Stanley, Union, Chester (SC), Chesterfield (SC), Lancaster (SC), York (SC).

The Scholarship Committee will consider the following when selecting finalists:

- Academic performance
- Evidence of the pursuit of personal excellence
- School and community engagement
- Desire to enrich the lives of others through the performing arts
- Career potential in a non-performance area of the performing arts as evidenced by a portfolio presentation and appropriate references
- Financial need



Application Process

- 1. Application forms will be available and downloadable on **December 7, 2018** at www.blumenthalarts.org/scholarships.
- 2. All application packets must be received by **April 1, 2019**. Application packets must contain:
 - a. Completed Scholarship Application Form (typed responses only)
 - b. One-page essay detailing why applicant is applying for the Gordon Hay Scholarship
 - c. Most recent transcript from applicant's high school
 - d. of the 2018-2019 Student Aid Report*
 - e. Reference Contact Form and recommendation letter from a current teacher or industry professional
 - f. Copy of a college acceptance letter and any financial aid award letters received (If not yet received, copies must be later submitted upon request).
- 3. From the total number of applicants, the Scholarship Committee will select finalists for the scholarship. All applicants will be notified of their candidacy status no later than Friday, **April 12, 2019**.
- 4. All finalists will be invited to the Gordon Hay Scholarship Interviews on Saturday, **April 27**, **2019**.
 - a. All finalists will be scheduled in 15 minute intervals beginning at 9 AM and concluding no later than 6 PM. Each student will have a maximum of 14 minutes with the Scholarship Committee. (Students should take no more than 7 minutes for the portfolio presentation in order to allow 7 minutes for questions by the scholarship committee
 - b. Specific portfolio presentation and interview times will be assigned according to logistical concerns no later than April 23.
 - c. Portfolios may include show programs, photos, letters of appreciation or commendation, illustrations, memorabilia which portray artistry, ability, and any other relevant items. A computer DVD player will be available if portfolio includes video elements. In cases where portfolio materials are extremely limited, the Scholarship Committee will rely heavily on the discussion portion of the meeting and reference letters in the application packet.

^{*}A Student Aid Report (SAR) is a paper or electronic document that provides basic information about a student's eligibility for federal student aid and lists your answers to the questions on your FAFSA. Parents of students applying for the Gordon Hay Scholarship are encouraged to complete and submit to the appropriate government offices their respective 2018 tax returns and Federal Application for Student Aid (FAFSA) applications no later than mid-February in order to meet the Gordon Hay Scholarship application deadline of Monday, April 1, 2019. If you provided a valid e-mail address on your FAFSA application, you will receive an email with instructions on how to access a copy of your SAR. If you did not provide an email address on your FAFSA application, you will receive either a SAR or a SAR Acknowledgement via post mail. Typically, one will be able to access the SAR within two weeks of filing the FAFSA report. FAFSA information may be accessed at www.fafsa.ed.gov.



5. All finalists will be notified on May 7 of their scholarship recipient status.

All application packets must be received by April 1, 2019.
